BOSTON GROUNDWATER TRUST (BGwT) BOARD MEETING September 14th, 2023

The Board of Trustees of the Boston Groundwater Trust met in the Patriot meeting room at the Lenox Hotel located at 61 Exeter Street, Boston, MA. The Executive Director electronically distributed the meeting notice and agenda to the City Clerk at Boston City Hall in accordance with the provisions of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts' Open Meeting Law.

Mr. Robert Whitney, co-chair, read the following statement:

"I, Robert Whitney, co-chair of the Boston Groundwater Trust, am calling this meeting to order at 4:08 pm. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Executive Or-der Suspending Certain Provisions of the Open Meeting Law, we are conducting this meeting on-line. To ensure public access to the deliberations of the BOSTON GROUND-WATER TRUST, the public may access this meeting through telephone and video conferencing. Members of the public will have an opportunity to ask questions and provide public comment. To do so please, "raise your hand" in the application via the Zoom meeting platform. 1. <u>New Trustees</u>

Mr. Simonelli introduced two new Trustees: Sharon Durkan, Boston City Councilor - District 8, who replaced Councilor Ed Flynn, and Nick Pittman, Real Estate Senior Project Manager, Fenway Community & Development Corporation, who replaced Leah Camhi. Discussion followed.

2. Adoption of July 13th, 2023, Board Meeting Minutes

Meeting minutes were previously emailed to Board members for review. Discussion followed.

Mr. Mitchell, Trustee, moved to adopt the minutes. Mr. Whitney seconded the motion.

Voted: To adopt the Board meeting minutes for July 13th, 2023.

3. <u>Financial Report</u>

Mr. Whitney, co-chair, and Mr. Simonelli reviewed the Trust's financials. Mr. Simonelli noted that he has signed the annual contract with the City of Boston, and the Trust has received its FY24 funding from the City. Discussion followed. Mr. Simonelli also noted that bonds will need to be purchased and that he will work with Mr. Whitney, Treasurer, to purchase bonds. Discussion followed.

4. <u>EXECUTIVE SESSION: Executive Director Review and Contract</u>

Mr. Whitney moved that the Board enter executive session. Mr. Mitchell seconded the motion.

Voted: To enter executive session.

Mr. Simonelli exited the meeting room at approximately 4:17pm and the Board entered executive session.

Ms. Commerford stated that the Board would reconvene in open session after the executive session was completed.

Mr. Simonelli returned to the meeting room at approximately 4:42pm and the Board reconvened in open session.

5. <u>Remote Well Reading Device Update</u>

Mr. Simonelli stated that all 25 additional units purchased from BluCloud have been installed throughout the city. Discussion followed. Topics covered included:

- Images of an installed unit.
- The addition of a label on each unit that identifies the Trust as owner, with contact information.
- Cast iron roadway box covers have been replaced with aluminum covers to improve signal reception.
- Distribution of the 25 units throughout the different neighborhoods of the City of Boston.
- Alerts if a device is disturbed or the levels changes more the 1'.
- Ability to link to the BluCloud platform though the current observation well and building foundation information center on the Trust website.

- Security of the devices and roadway box covers.
- Battery life expectancy of reading unit and lifespan of datalogger.

6. <u>Current Website Design</u>

Mr. Simonelli reviewed the Trust website through the years. He displayed images of previous versions as well as of the current version (last updated in 2017.) Discussion followed. The Board will revisit at the next meeting after the Trustees have had a chance to review the proposed changes to the website and have provided their comments to Mr. Simonelli.

7. <u>Executive Director's Report</u>

BGwT Executive Director Mr. Christian Simonelli distributed his report. Discussion followed. Refer to the attached *Executive Director's Report September 14th, 2023,* for a complete list of activities. Topics covered included:

- Virtual meeting with newly-appointed Boston Water & Sewer Commissioner Armindo Goncalves.
- A City Council hearing on stormwater and the Trust's participation at that hearing.
- A City Council hearing to provide an update to both City and State officials on the progress of the City-State Groundwater Working Group.
- The next meeting of the Trust Technical Advisory Committee.
- Working with the Inspectional Services Department to conduct site visits at properties where sump pumps have been identified.
- Recent flooding events and the impacts on basements in the Back Bay.

8. <u>Other Business</u>

Mr. Simonelli noted the City's release of a document which reviews the zoning code and proposes a reform of the zoning code. Discussion followed. Mr. Simonelli will email the Trustees a copy of the report along with a reminder to review the Trust website for discussion at the next Board meeting.

Mr. Simonelli noted that he will follow-up with the City Clerk regarding new Trustee appointments and reappointments of existing Trustees.

Mr. Whitney moved to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Shilland, Trustee, seconded the motion.
